National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

The bishops of the United States established The National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year initiative that aims to inspire, educate, and unite the faithful in a more intimate relationship with Jesus present in the Eucharist. As part of this Eucharistic Revival, there will be a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana in June. The

National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is an opportunity for people throughout the United States to participate in this movement. There will be four major routes for the Pilgrimage, from the North, East, South, and West. Each route will have a big procession of the Blessed Eucharist, and all will end at the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. One route of this Eucharistic Pilgimage will come through Emmitsburg, MD and **you are invited to join the pilgrimage!**

In re: Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore Case No. 23-16969

Claims Notice for Victims of Sexual Abuse and Others with Claims Against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore

If you were sexually abused by any person or entity connected with the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore (also known as the Archdiocese of Baltimore), a Roman Catholic parish or Roman Catholic school within the geographical area of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Baltimore, or have any claim against the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, you must file a claim by <u>May 31, 2024</u>. If you fail to file a timely claim,

you may lose the right to assert a claim at a later date.
