Since its inception in 1996, the Archdiocese of Baltimore's **Partners in Excellence (PIE) Scholarship Program** has awarded **\$38,035,153** in nearly **30,000** tuition assistance grants to families who otherwise could not afford the cost of a Catholic school education for their children.
